

- Hearing about us from our newsletters


Our speakers are:


Speaker Demographics Department 2015–2021 Our events have featured scientists from 23 departments since 2015

What are Broader Impacts and why are they important?

- The National Science Foundation has a clear mandate:
- Research will be funded based on
- 1. Intellectual Merit The potential of a project to advance
 - knowledge and understanding within its own field or across different fields
- 2. Broader Impact The potential of a project to benefit society or advance desired societal outcomes
- There is an expansion of funding agencies (NOT JUST NSF) that are exploring the importance of research impacts.

BROADER **IMPACT** OFFICE

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Areas of Broader Impacts

- Full participation of women, persons with disabilities and underrepresented minorities in STEM
- Improved STEM education and educator development at any level Increased public STEM literacy and public engagement with STEM • Improved well-being of individuals in society
- Development of a diverse, globally competitive STEM workforce
- Increased partnerships between academia, industry, and others
- Improved national security
- Increased economic competitiveness of the United States
- Enhanced infrastructure for research and education
