

SULI & CCI at Berkeley Lab

- Community College Internship (CCI) and Student Undergraduate Laboratory Internship (SULI):
 - Designed for undergraduates from 2-4 years of college and applies to most National Labs, including Berkeley Lab
 - Programs offered Spring, Summer and Fall
 - Students commit to working the full duration of the internship
 - This is a <u>PAID</u> internship!

Jobs at Berkeley Lab

- There are two ways to get hired:
 - Recruitment
 - Hire Only Students, UC Grad Students, Postdocs
- We follow a recruitment process for recruited positions
 - Every open position is tied to a recruiter who partners with the hiring managers
 - Our process for applying is using our <u>Careers Portal</u>
 - Typically, hiring managers will conduct panel interviews


