EHS 323 Asbestos Worker Refresher

Course Purpose: This AHERA approved course reviews how to perform a variety of asbestos abatement activities including pre- abatement cleaning and set-up, proper removal and other abatement methods, asbestos housekeeping and maintenance-related.

Audience: This course is intended for personnel involved with the removal, encapsulation, enclosure, and repair of asbestos-containing materials for Class I and II operations, such as work involving the disturbance of asbestos containing materials, including surfacing materials, thermal system insulation, and miscellaneous materials, in quantities larger than can be contained within a single waste or glove bag less than 60 inches in width.

NOTE: Respiratory protection is required for performing asbestos work. Medical approval is required for wearing respiratory protection, but not necessarily for completing this training. If an employee is not medically able to wear respiratory protection, there should be no need for this training.

Course Objectives:

- Review the history and uses of asbestos, health effects and medical surveillance.
- Review the work practices and principles for handling asbestos properly.
- Review how to collect air samples, conduct visual inspections and latest technology in asbestos abatement.
- Review how to build a containment, use abatement tools and review issues related to actual removal of material.
