## Japan-US. Experimental Institute for Physics with Exotic Nuclei (JUSEIPEN)

A framework to help promote and establish strong collaborations between U.S. and Japanese scientists for experiments using rare isotope beams.

A way to "jump start" programs - seed for future funding

## Specifically:

- Can provide funds for U.S. scientists to travel to RIKEN/Japan in support of JUSEIPEN's goals.
- Can help coordinate effort on the science goals and logistics (hardware, people, timing, etc) for U.S. involvement in RIBF.
- Can organize workshops and meetings.

JUSEIPEN will have a steering committee with representatives from the U.S. and Japan, which will be responsible for the overall coordination and implementation of JUSEIPEN's activities and will review applications for visitor support funds ("JUSEIPEN grants").

→ Modeled on the existing theory collaboration JUSTIPEN

Visitor office space, computers, and access to conference rooms at RIKEN.
